One of the main issues with these kind of pursuits is that we may shove others out of the way to get what we want. I mean, think about it: how many times have you heard the news story on Black Friday of someone getting seriously hurt or injured as they attempt to grab hold of that special thing on sale (usually a giant TV) that is going to change their life? If you are like me, you have heard this story too many times. The more we pursue this type of fulfillment, the more we become curved in on ourselves. We navel-gaze. We ask questions like, "What is the next thing I want? What would make me happy? How can I get this? How can I get that? Boy, that would sure make my life easier, wouldn't it? Our culture promotes this. And the more self-absorbed we become, the less important other people become to us.



So then, we come to the terrible irony that some are facing in our region this spring. The loss of those possessions. For the self-absorbed and self-serving, this type of loss can mean the loss in spring storms and power outages is of anything and everything that matters to them. When facing this kind of loss, our natural inclination is to be driven further into ourselves and our broken condition.

We lose sight of anything and everything that isn't about "me". It is in that moment, that we must seek to stop the ever-plummeting spiral downward, into ourselves, into despair. A lesson to be learned is that happiness is not to be found in the accumulation of stuff that is here today and can be tossed away tomorrow. Happiness and fulfillment are to be found in relationship. Other people in our lives are the true blessing. As we have all too often shoved others out of the way to get to what we want; those who we have shoved out of the way may be exactly what we need. So what about you? Where has you gaze been fixed lately? Have the experiences that you have been thru afforded you a new opportunity to change your gaze and see where the real, lasting blessings in your life can actually be found? God created each of us to be in a relationship. Relationship with Him and with each other. And God works in mysterious ways. Now is a perfect time to look up and look out. Look and see the blessings all around you. God has given us each other to help us get through together when times are tough and to celebrate together when times are joyful. But the key is together. So, friends, let's continue this journey together, knowing that the Lord has given us each other for just such a time as this.

#### Called to Serve Others

Throughout all four Gospels, we read how the life of Jesus was one of total service and sacrifice. Jesus declared, "even as the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life as a ransom for many" (Matthew 20:28). Jesus continually served the hungry, handicapped, sick, and homeless. His loving and servant heart was seen in all that He said and did. Following His example during the three years He spent on earth, we realize that our purpose, too, is to serve. He lived for His heavenly Father and for others. Just as Jesus served His Father, we exist to serve Him. Being conformed into the image of Christ we will take on the role of servants as He did.

The concept of serving rather than being served is not a natural one. We, by nature, prefer to be "number one." We're too wrapped up in ourselves even to notice the needs of others. Jerry White, in his book *Honesty, Morality, and Conscience*, writes,

Christians are to be servants of both God and people, but most of us approach business, work, and life in general with the attitude of what I can get rather than what I can give. Serving God receives a favorable response but serving people, especially those who cannot repay us, has no visible benefit or glory from anyone except God.



A life of service is contrary to what our society promotes. We are told that we should aspire to fame, power, and wealth. Servants receive no glory, spotlight, or fame, but a meaningful relationship with Christ is not possible if we put ourselves first and seek only the goals that are important to the world that we live in. Living a life of service, we give of ourselves without striving for financial rewards or glory. Unlike the praise we receive from God, worldly praise has no lasting value. Along with the Apostle Paul we say that we are "not to please man, but to please God Who tests our hearts" (1 Thessalonians 2:4).

#### Handle with Care

We have all received fragile items in boxes that are marked "Handle with Care." In some ways, the gifts we receive as stewards from God should be marked with the words "Handle with Care." Shouldn't we handle our blessings such as abilities, money, time, physical health, and relationships with utmost care? In essence, we are handling with care the blessings He entrusts to us when we are faithful and responsible with them. Realizing all of life is a gift helps us to receive with gratitude and to handle our blessings with care and thankfulness.
