## God Gets Us Through

In and around the Kaiser house, the summer has often been a time to get some much-needed projects checked off our to-do list. Last summer we painted the exterior of our house (22 gallons of paint!!) and this year, I plan to put the finishing touches on the basement, then get back outside and work on the deck with some lighting changes in the front yard. Should make for a busy summer.

One of my most memorable summer projects happened a few years back when I took on a retaining wall project. Talk about labor-intensive!! There is nothing like shoveling dirt, lifting wall blocks and hauling buckets of gravel to get the blood pumping and the sweat rolling.



It was during this process that I came to a startling conclusion: I am older than I used to be!! I found that objects I could lift and move with ease 10 years ago, now put up quite a fight. I had aches in joints that I had never had before and found that ice packs were much more necessary to sooth my aching back each night. The entire experience reminded me of those famous words from the prophet Isaiah, chapter 40:30-31, "Even youths shall faint and be weary, and

young men shall fall exhausted; <sup>31</sup> but they who wait for the LORD shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings like eagles; they shall run and not be weary; they shall walk and not faint.

The process of aging makes us all reevaluate as we go along. As our bodies wear out over time, it points us to a harsh reality. We need help. We can't do what we used to do. We have to think about it more. We have to pace ourselves. And the hurts and aches are more pronounced and linger longer. Our physical condition begins to reflect more and more our spiritual condition. Helpless,



hopeless, broken and in pain. It becomes clearer as we suffer: We need Jesus!

When we are young, we think we can accomplish anything. But Isaiah reminds us that even the young wear out and fall exhausted. Perhaps as we age, one of the benefits is that we realize that we need God sooner and more often than we did when we were young.

In the past, I know I didn't pray during my projects like I did when I was building that retaining wall. I don't think I felt that I had to before, but that retaining wall changed some things. ;-) I was praying all the time! "God, give me the strength to lift 10 more blocks, 5 more blocks, one more block before I finish." "God please just keep the pain in my hands and back manageable." "God, even a little breeze would be so wonderful right now!" And as I prayed about my issues, something remarkable happened; I started thinking and praying for others in need in my family, congregation and community. I started giving God thanks for His awesome gifts: Our wonderful home, agreeable weather, our beautiful group of believers at our church and His continued work in the And I thanked Jesus for His gifts of forgiveness, life and salvation. God used my pains and discomforts to draw me closer to Him and to pray for others.

Sooner than expected, that retaining wall was built; completed from top to bottom. But this time around it was clearer to me than ever, "The Lord got me through!" No matter what I am facing, this will always be the case! God will get me through. I guess if it takes a few more aches and pains and a few more days of recuperation to open my eyes



to God's blessings, then so be it. Getting older may not be for wimps, but for us Christians we know that we don't age alone. God is with us each day, blessing us with all we need to carry on. Whether we realize it or not, God will get us through. To Him be the Glory!

## Checking on our Job as Stewards

A young boy walks into a small drug store and asks the druggist, "Could I use the telephone?"

The druggist replies, "You certainly can," and shows him where the telephone is. The boy calls a grocery store and asks the man who answers the phone, "Is your grocery store looking for someone to stock the shelves?" The man says, "No, we already have a stock boy." The boy inquires, "If he isn't doing a good job, maybe you need to get someone who will do a better job." The man replies, "No, we are pleased with the work the boy is doing," so the boy hung up the telephone.

The druggist hears the conversation and says to the boy, "I'm sorry you didn't get the job." The boy says, "I don't need a job, because I am the stock boy. I was checking to see what they thought of my work."

What if we could call God to ask about the job we are doing as His stewards? If it were possible to call, what kind of response would you expect to hear? Would God see you as a person who acknowledges all that you have as having been given to you by Him and yourself as a manager, not an owner? Would God tell you that you are using your time, talents, and money in ways that please Him? Would God commend you for feeding the hungry, for sheltering the homeless, for giving generously to those in need? Would God be pleased with what you are giving to His Church? Would God tell you, "Well done, good and faithful steward" (Matthew 25:23)?

Unfortunately, we all fall well short of God's standards, but, because of what Christ did for us on the cross, we are forgiven for all the times that we have failed to be faithful stewards. With God's grace given to us through His Son, we can be molded and transformed into God-pleasing stewards. In Christ, we can be stewards who do God's work well.

## Testing your Knowledge of Scripture

Do you know who in Scripture gave some land for the work of the Lord?

If you said Barnabas, you were right. In Acts 4:36-37 we read, "Joseph, a Levite from Cyprus, whom the apostles called Barnabas (which means Son of Encouragement), sold a field he owned and brought the money and put it at the apostles' feet."



In the early church, there were no needy people because no one claimed that any of his possessions were his own. Through the working of the Holy Spirit, they shared with one another. Those with plenty gave to those in need. Barnabas willingly gave the land he owned for the work of the apostles.


## The Classroom Chronicles -continued

### What is Evidence Based Accreditation?

Evidence Based Accreditation (EBA) is objective rather than subjective in nature. It requires that schools identify evidence and practices pertaining to each indicator. The significance of the evidence and its impact results in a high indicator rating by the school. Through this, the EBA process removes the subjective nature of what a school hopes to become and requires realistic objective evaluation of the current school and their present strengths and accomplishments.




